

**Gigantic Cable Scarf** *with* Jill Draper

Learn traditional cabling on this oversize scarf, with large needles and three strands of yarn held together. The scale of the scarf knits up quickly and allows you to really see what you're knitting. Jill teaches you how to cable to the front or back. The result is new knitting knowledge, as well as a sculptural scarf that can be a solid color, or ombre through different colors of yarn.

Learn how to:

- Knit a traditional cable pattern
- Cable from front to back

Materials:

- 3 hanks worsted weight yarn, each 275 yds
- Size 15017 (10-12mm) knitting needles
- Chopstick or pencil for cabling
- Yarn needle

Gauge:

- Approx. 2 sts/1" using three strands of yarn held together

*Abbreviations:***K:** Knit**P:** Purl**WS:** Wrong side**RS:** Right side**BO:** Bind off

C16F: Cable 16 front; put the next 8 stitches on chopstick or pencil, hold stitches to the front, knit 8 stitches from left hand needle, k 8 stitches from cable needle

C16B: Cable 16 back; put the next 8 stitches on chopstick or pencil, hold stitches to the back, knit 8 stitches from left hand needle, k 8 stitches from cable needle or chopstick

Cast on 24 sts

Row 1: (and all following WS rows) Purl

Row 2: (RS) Knit

Row 3: (WS) Purl

Row 4: C16F, K8

Rows 5-13: P the WS rows and K the RS rows

Row 14: k8, C16B

Rows 15-23: P the WS rows and K the RS rows

Repeat rows 4-23 for pattern until desired length.

For matching ends BO 3 rows after a cable row. Cut yarn, leaving a long tail, and weave in ends.
