



Turkish Flat Weave Bracelet *with* Alix Bluh

Jewelry designer Alix Bluh shows you how to crochet with beads using a traditional stitch. The result is a subtly bejeweled, bohemian bracelet that can be adapted depending on what kind of cord and beads you use. It lays flat and looks even better with a couple variations stacked on your wrist. Alix talks through the different options – as well as two different kinds of closures: a toggle or stitching in a vintage button.



What You'll Learn

- Crocheted Turkish Flat Weave stitch
- Creating crochet button loop
- Using shank button as a bracelet closure

Materials Needed

- At least 4yds 3ply nylon cord, embroidery floss or silk thread
- Beads with a large enough hole to fit onto chosen thread
- 1.75mm crochet hook
- Hypo cement
- Super Glue
- Scissors
- Tapestry or embroidery needle
- Vintage button or toggle
